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# 1 GENERAL INFORMATION



Johannesburg, colloquially known as Joburg, Jozi, or eGoli ("The City of Gold"), is South Africa's largest metropolis, its financial engine room, and an incredibly high-energy cultural capital. Founded during the 1886 gold rush, it has evolved from a dusty mining camp into a vibrant urban forest blanketed by over 10 million trees. For tourists, Joburg offers a profound journey through South Africa's complex path to democracy, coupled with a booming modern creative scene, elite shopping, and world class dining.

## Essential Historical & Cultural Sites

The city serves as the emotional heart of South Africa's modern history, offering raw and moving glimpses into the triumph over apartheid.

➤ **The Apartheid Museum:** An essential, world-renowned immersion into the rise and fall of state-enforced segregation.

➤ **Constitution Hill:** A former prison fort that once held Nelson Mandela and Mahatma Gandhi, now transformed into the home of South Africa's Constitutional Court.

**Soweto:** South Africa's most famous township. Tour Vilakazi Street—the only street in the world to have housed two Nobel Peace Prize winners (Nelson Mandela and Archbishop Desmond Tutu).

**Johannesburg** features an unexpected terrain shaped by ancient geology and dramatic human intervention. Far from being a flat concrete jungle, its landscape is defined by rugged quartz ridges, rolling high-altitude grasslands, a massive man-made urban forest, and towering industrial mining legacy sites.

### VACCINE RECOMMENDATIONS

No mandatory vaccinations are required to enter South Africa for travelers arriving directly from Western Europe or North America. However, you must prioritize specific mandatory, recommended, and seasonal vaccines depending on your travel itinerary and flight connections.

DISEASE	RECOMMENDATION
Yellow Fever	Mandatory if travelling from or transiting for more than 12 hours through an airport in a Yellow Fever risk country (certain parts of Central Africa or South America).
Hepatitis A	Vaccination recommended
Typhoid	Vaccination recommended
Influenza (Flu Shot)	Vaccination strongly recommended
COVID-19	Ensure update
Routine Vaccines	Ensure update
Hepatitis B	Vaccination recommended

\* Recommended if visiting remote rural areas. If bitten, seek medical advice without delay. Recommendations that are marked "Vaccination sometimes recommended" should be considered as "Vaccination strongly recommended" if a person is travelling frequently or spending extended time in that country, or if a person's occupation or planned activities could put them at higher risk. It is important to get expert advice.

Recommendations do change from time to time and it is important to discuss your personal requirements with your doctor. Medical insurance is highly recommended as there are no reciprocal health agreements. Medical facilities are generally of a high standard in Johannesburg, South Africa, varying quality outside the capital. Immediate cash payment is often expected by doctors. Many medicines that require a prescription in North America and Europe can be bought over the pharmacy counter in South Africa schedule dependent, although they may be known under a different name here. If you require a regular medication, bring the packaging into the pharmacy with you to show the pharmacist.

## 5 VISA AND PASSPORT REQUIREMENTS

### PASSPORTS

A valid passport with at least 30 days remaining after your intended departure date and at least two completely blank visa pages.

- **Visa-Exempt Nationalities:** Citizens from over 50 countries—including the United States, Canada, the United Kingdom, Australia, New Zealand, and most European Union nations—do not need a visa for tourist stays of up to 90 days.
- **Visa-Required Nationalities:** If your passport is not from a visa-exempt country, you must apply for a Visitor's Visa in advance through a South African embassy or via the official e-Visa portal before you travel.

### PROOF OF ONWARD TRAVEL & FUNDS

Immigration officers at the border frequently ask to see:

- **Return Ticket:** Proof of a confirmed onward or return airline ticket showing you intend to exit the country before your visa or 90-day exemption expires.
- **Financial Sufficiency:** Proof of sufficient funds (such as recent bank statements) to cover your living expenses for the duration of your stay.

### TRAVELLING WITH CHILDREN UNDER THE AGE OF 18

South Africa has strict regulations to prevent child trafficking. If you are traveling with minors, you must carry:

- **A valid Unabridged Birth Certificate** (or an official equivalent) showing the full details of both parents.
- **Parental Consent Affidavits:** If a child is traveling with only one parent, with an adult who is not their parent, or unaccompanied, you must carry certified affidavits from the

### OTHER RISKS

Tap water is generally considered safe in main cities and towns, especially in Johannesburg, but otherwise bottled water is recommended. If bottled water is unavailable then boil water for over a minute before drinking. The 'Traveler's Tummy' Factor is to be considered as tap water may contain different harmless bacterial blends than what your digestive system is used to back home. If you have a sensitive stomach, sticking to bottled or filtered water can prevent minor adjustments or discomfort.

non-travelling parent(s) authorizing the travel, along with copies of their passports or ID documents.

### RECIPROCITY FEES

South Africa does not charge a separate "reciprocity fee" or entry tax at the border for tourists. The total cost to enter the country as a tourist depends entirely on whether your nationality requires a standard tourist visa in advance.

#### If You Hold a Passport from a Visa-Exempt Country

If your passport is from a country on South Africa's visa-exemption list—which includes the United States, Canada, United Kingdom, Australia, New Zealand, and most European Union nations—you enter completely free of charge.

- **The Cost:** R0 / \$0
- **The Rule:** You will receive a free tourist endorsement stamp in your passport at the border control desk allowing you to stay for up to 90 days


#### If Your Country Requires a Visa in Advance

If your nationality is not on the visa-exempt list, you must apply for a Visitor's Visa ahead of time through a South African embassy, consulate, or via the Department of Home Affairs e-Visa portal.

- **Standard Visa Fee:** Generally around R520 to R760 (converted to your local currency), depending on the location of the consulate processing your paperwork
- **Visa Fee Exemptions:** Certain nations (like India, Colombia, and Mexico) are required to apply for a tourist visa before traveling but are completely exempt from paying the visa application fee

## CRUCIAL BORDER DOCUMENT CHECK

Even though there are no hidden fees or taxes at airport arrivals, immigration officers can turn you away if you do not have:

- **Blank Passport Pages:** At least two completely blank visa pages side-by-side.
- **Onward Travel:** A confirmed, printed return or onward airline ticket out of South Africa.
- **Yellow Fever Certificate:** Only if you are flying in from a designated  **Yellow Fever transmission risk zone.**

## VALIDITY

To enter South Africa, your passport must be valid for at least 30 days after your intended date of departure from the country. However, immigration officials and airlines strongly recommend having at least 6 months of validity remaining from your date of entry to prevent any travel disruptions or issues with connecting flights.

## APPLICATION TO

- **The Official e-Visa Portal:** Available online for citizens of approved countries via the Department of Home Affairs website.
- **South African Embassies or Consulates:** The diplomatic mission or high commission representing South Africa in your home country.
- **VFS Global Centres Abroad:** In many countries, the South African government outsources the physical collection of documents and biometrics to VFS Global partner offices.

## WORKING DAYS

Official processing timelines vary significantly based on your application location and visa type:

### Standard Processing Timelines

- **Tourist Visa Extensions (In-Country via VFS):** Legally takes 30 to 40 working days. Because of frequent backlogs at the Pretoria head office, it is critical to submit your extension request at least 60 days before your initial 90-day tourist entry stamp expires.
- **Online e-Visas (From Abroad):** Officially takes 5 to 10 working days. However, processing can occasionally take up to 20 working days during peak travel seasons, so you should apply well in advance of your flight.
- **Standard Embassy Visa Applications:** Typically takes 10 to 15 working days from the date you physically submit your passport and biometrics at your local consulate or foreign VFS hub.

## ENTRY WITH CHILDREN

South Africa enforces strict border regulations to combat child trafficking. If you are entering or departing the country with any child under the age of 18, you must present specific legal documentation at the immigration desk alongside their valid passport.

## 6 EMBASSIES INFORMATION IN SOUTH AFRICA

South Africa hosts **134 foreign embassies and high commissions**. The vast majority of these diplomatic missions are situated in Pretoria, the administrative capital. Johannesburg hosts zero official primary embassies, as almost all nations base their formal embassies and high commissions in Pretoria, South Africa's administrative capital.

However, Johannesburg functions as the diplomatic commercial hub of the country, housing around 25 foreign missions. These include:

**Consulates-General:** Offices representing major nations such as the United States, China, France, India, and Angola to handle trade, visas, and citizen services.

**Honorary Consulates:** Smaller, volunteer-led representations assisting citizens of foreign nations.

**Trade Offices:** Specialized missions dedicated strictly to business and commerce.

## 7 CURRENCY AND BANK INFORMATION FOR JOHANNESBURG

### CURRENCY INFORMATION

#### South African rand (ZAR; symbol R)

The official currency of South Africa is the South African rand. ®  
Currency Code: ZAR (Zuid-Afrikaanse Rand).

Subdivision: 1 rand is divided into 100 cents.

Legal Tender: It is also used legally alongside local currencies in Namibia, Lesotho, and Eswatini through the Common Monetary Area.

### CREDIT CARDS

Most major credit cards are accepted, mainly Visa and Mastercard.

#### Card Acceptance Breakdown

- **Visa & Mastercard:** Accepted at almost 100% of card-handling merchants, including hotels, restaurants, supermarkets, and ATMs.
- **American Express (Amex):** Accepted mostly at major hotel chains, car rental agencies, and high-end restaurants, but often rejected by smaller merchants due to higher transaction fees.
- **Diners Club:** Acceptance is limited and declining, though still usable at some premium travel and hospitality venues.

## ATM

Automated Teller Machines (ATMs) are widely available and highly advanced throughout South Africa. You will easily find them in all cities, towns, shopping malls, petrol stations, and transport hubs.

### Key ATM Guidelines

- **Card Compatibility:** International Visa and Mastercard debit or credit cards work seamlessly at virtually all local ATMs.
- **Fees:** Your home bank will charge a foreign withdrawal fee. Local banks also charge a minor non-network convenience fee (usually between R20 to R50).
- **Withdrawal Limits:** Standard daily limits for international cards typically range from R3,000 to R5,000 per day, depending on the machine and your home bank.
- **Currency Dispensed:** ATMs strictly dispense South African rand (ZAR) banknotes.

## TRAVELLERS CHEQUES

Traveller's cheques are completely obsolete and no longer accepted in South Africa.

## BANKING HOURS

Standard physical bank branches in South Africa generally operate from 08:30 or 09:00 to 15:30 or 16:00 on weekdays.

## CURRENCY RESTRICTION

South Africa enforces strict exchange controls and physical cash limits regulated by the [South African Revenue Service \(SARS\)](#) and the [South African Reserve Bank \(SARB\)](#).

### Limits for International Travellers

If you are entering or leaving South Africa, you must declare currency values that exceed the following legal thresholds:

- **South African Banknotes (ZAR):** You can carry up to R100 000 in cash per person. Anything over this specific amount is legally restricted and requires prior written permission from the SARB. (Note: This limit was increased from R25 000 to R100 000 in the 2026 Budget).
- **Foreign Currency (USD, EUR, GBP, etc.):** There is no cap on how much foreign cash you can bring into the country. However, you must officially declare cash amounts exceeding \$10 000 USD (or its equivalent in other currencies) on the SARS Online Traveller Declaration form upon arrival.
- **Gold Coins:** Gold coins (including local Krugerrands) have separate strict export constraints and require explicit proof of purchase.

## CURRENCY EXCHANGE

Currency exchange in South Africa is heavily regulated and can only be legally processed by Authorised Dealers (licenced commercial banks) and Bureaux de Change.

### Where to Exchange Currency

- **Commercial Banks:** Main branches of ABSA, FNB, Nedbank, and Standard Bank offer standard foreign exchange services.
- **Specialised Bureaux:** Major dedicated providers include Bidvest Bank and [Travelex South Africa](#), which have kiosks at all major international airports (OR Tambo, Cape Town International, and King Shaka) and tourist hubs.

### Mandatory Legal Requirements

To exchange physical foreign cash or buy traveler's cards at a counter, you must physically present:

- **A valid international Passport.**
- **Proof of travel, such as an e-ticket or flight itinerary.**
- **Proof of residential address (only required if you are a South African resident or opening a temporary profile).**

## DUTY FREE

### Maximum Consumable Allowances (Per Adult)

If you are 18 years or older, you can pass through the green customs channel with the following maximum amounts:

- **Tobacco:** 200 cigarettes, 20 cigars, and 250 grams of tobacco.
- **Alcohol:** 1 litre of spirits/liquor and 2 litres of wine.
- **Fragrance:** 50ml of perfume and 250ml of eau de toilette

### General Goods and Gift Allowance

- **Value Limit:** You can bring in new or used personal gifts and souvenirs up to a total value of R5 000 completely duty-free.
- **Regional Exception:** If you are arriving directly from a SACU country (Botswana, Lesotho, Namibia, or Eswatini), this general goods limit is extended up to R25 000.
- **Non-Pooling Regulation:** Allowances are strictly calculated per individual. Family members travelling together cannot pool their limits to cover a single expensive item.

## BANNED IMPORTS

### Prohibited Goods (Completely Banned)

You cannot bring these items into South Africa under any circumstances:

- **Narcotics:** All illicit drugs and dependency-inducing substances.
- **Weapons:** Fully automatic firearms, military weapons, explosives, and ammunition.
- **Counterfeit Goods:** Fake luxury goods, clothing, or footwear infringing on trademarks.
- **Unlawful Media:** Graphic adult material, hate speech, or content promoting violence.
- **Prison-Made Goods:** Any commercial products manufactured using prison labor.
- **Toxic Substances:** Hazardous chemical waste and dangerous radioactive materials.

### Restricted Goods (Require Permits or Certificates)

These items will be confiscated at customs unless you present the required legal documentation:

- **Medication:** Personal prescription medicine is limited to a 3-month supply and requires a signed doctor's prescription.
- **Plants and Food:** Fresh fruits, vegetables, seeds, honey, and dairy products require a phytosanitary certificate from the Department of Agriculture.
- **Animal Products:** Raw meat, skins, poultry, and feathers require strict veterinary import permits.
- **Endangered Species:** Any products made from protected wildlife (ivory, reptile skins, tortoise shell) require a global CITES permit.
- **Firearms:** Hunting rifles or personal handguns require a temporary import permit from the South African Police Service (SAPS).
- **Gold and Coins:** Unmanufactured gold, gold coins, and mineral specimens require a South African Reserve Bank permit.

## 8 FOOD AND DRINKS IN SOUTH AFRICA

South African cuisine is famously diverse, often called "Rainbow Cuisine" because it blends indigenous African, Dutch, Malay, French, Indian, and British culinary traditions.

### MUST-TRY TRADITIONAL FOODS

- **Biltong & Droëwors:** Cured, air-dried meat (similar to jerky but much thicker and richer), typically made from beef or game like kudu and springbok.
- **Braai:** The authentic South African barbecue. It is a major social ritual where meats like boerewors (spiced coriander sausage), steak, and lamb chops are cooked strictly over wood or charcoal fires.
- **Bunny Chow:** A famous Durban street food consisting of a hollowed-out loaf of white bread filled to the brim with spicy mutton, chicken, or bean curry.
- **Bobotie:** A Cape Malay dish featuring spiced minced meat baked with an egg-based custard topping, served alongside yellow rice and raisins.
- **Chakalaka & Pap:** A spicy vegetable relish (tomatoes, onions, beans, and chillies) served cold alongside hot pap (a traditional maize meal porridge).
- **Melktert:** A classic sweet dessert featuring a delicate pastry crust filled with a creamy, cinnamon-infused milk custard.



### ICONIC LOCAL DRINKS

- **South African Wine:** World-class wines produced primarily in the Western Cape region, famous for Pinotage (a unique local red grape variety) and crisp Chenin Blanc.
- **Rooibos Tea:** A naturally caffeine-free, herbal red bush tea harvested exclusively in the Cederberg mountains, packed with antioxidants.
- **Amarula:** A rich, sweet cream liqueur made from the fermented fruit of the indigenous African marula tree.
- **Local Beers:** Popular commercial lagers like Castle and Carling Black Label sit alongside a massive, highly innovative craft beer brewing culture across the major cities.

**SPECIALITIES**

Johannesburg's food specialties reflect its history as a gold-mining boomtown that attracted people from all over the world. The city's unique culinary style is defined by a fusion of traditional African flavours, street food culture, and high-end contemporary dining.



**Local Culinary Specialties & Street Food**

- **The Kotota:** Johannesburg's ultimate street food champion, originating in the townships. It is a quarter-loaf of white bread hollowed out and packed with chips (fries), polony, cheese, a fried egg, and a variety of sauces.
- **Mogodu and Pap:** Slow-cooked, deeply seasoned tripe (mogodu) served alongside stiff maize porridge (pap). It is a comforting local staple found everywhere from township street stalls to upscale urban eateries.
- **Chesanyama:** A Zulu phrase meaning "burnt meat," this is Jo'zi's specific style of barbecue. You choose raw meats (boerewors, steaks, chicken wings) at a butchery, and they grill it for you over open flames while you enjoy the lively music and atmosphere.
- **Soweto Magwinya:** Golden, deep-fried fat cakes (doughnuts without the hole) that are crisp on the outside and fluffy inside. They are typically eaten hot for breakfast, often sliced open and filled with polony or cheese.

**TIPPING**

Standard Rate: A tip of 10% to 15% of the total bill is expected for satisfactory service.

**DRINKING AGE**

The legal drinking age in South Africa is 18 years old.

## 10 TRAVELING AROUND SOUTH AFRICA

The best ways to travel around Johannesburg depend on your budget, safety preferences, and destination.

### RECOMMENDED TRANSPORT OPTIONS

- **Uber and Bolt (E-Hailing):** This is the safest and most convenient method for international travelers. Cars are affordable, readily available via smartphone apps, and eliminate the need to navigate complex routes yourself.
- **The Gautrain:** A world-class, rapid-rail network connecting OR Tambo International Airport directly to major commercial hubs like Sandton, Rosebank, and Pretoria. It is highly secure, fast, and completely bypasses traffic.
- **Hop-On Hop-Off Bus (City Sightseeing):** The iconic red double-decker bus is the best way to sightsee. It loops safely through major tourist attractions like the Apartheid Museum, Constitution Hill, and Gold Reef City.
- **Car Rental:** Renting a vehicle from the airport gives you maximum flexibility if you plan to explore outskirts like the Cradle of Humankind. Remember that South Africans drive on the left side of the road.

### ESSENTIAL TRAVEL SECURITY TIPS

- **Lock Your Doors:** When driving or sitting in an Uber, keep your windows up and car doors locked at all times to prevent smash-and-grab thefts at intersections.

- **Hide Valuables:** Never leave laptops, bags, or mobile phones visible on your car seats; stow them securely in the boot (trunk).
- **Avoid Walking at Night:** Do not walk between neighborhoods after dark. Always call an Uber to take you directly from door to door, even for short distances.

Road conditions in and around Johannesburg are a mix of world-class highway networks and severely deteriorating suburban streets.

### THE URBAN POTHOLE CRISIS

- **Suburban Streets:** Local roads face severe deterioration, particularly following recent heavy seasonal rains. Suburbs across Randburg, Ferndale, Sandton, and Bryanston are heavily affected by growing pothole networks.
- **Infrastructure Stress:** The Johannesburg Roads Agency (JRA) reports handling close to 1,000 new potholes per week.
- **Night Driving Risks:** Potholes can be deep enough to blow out tires or bend rims. It is highly advised to avoid speeding at night when water accumulation or low visibility hides road craters.
- **Community Repairs:** To combat the backlog, private-public partnerships like the Discovery Pothole Patrol operate across the city to repair high-traffic zones.
